- **Cognitive Behavioral Therapies address the connections between criminal and addictive thinking and behaviors.**

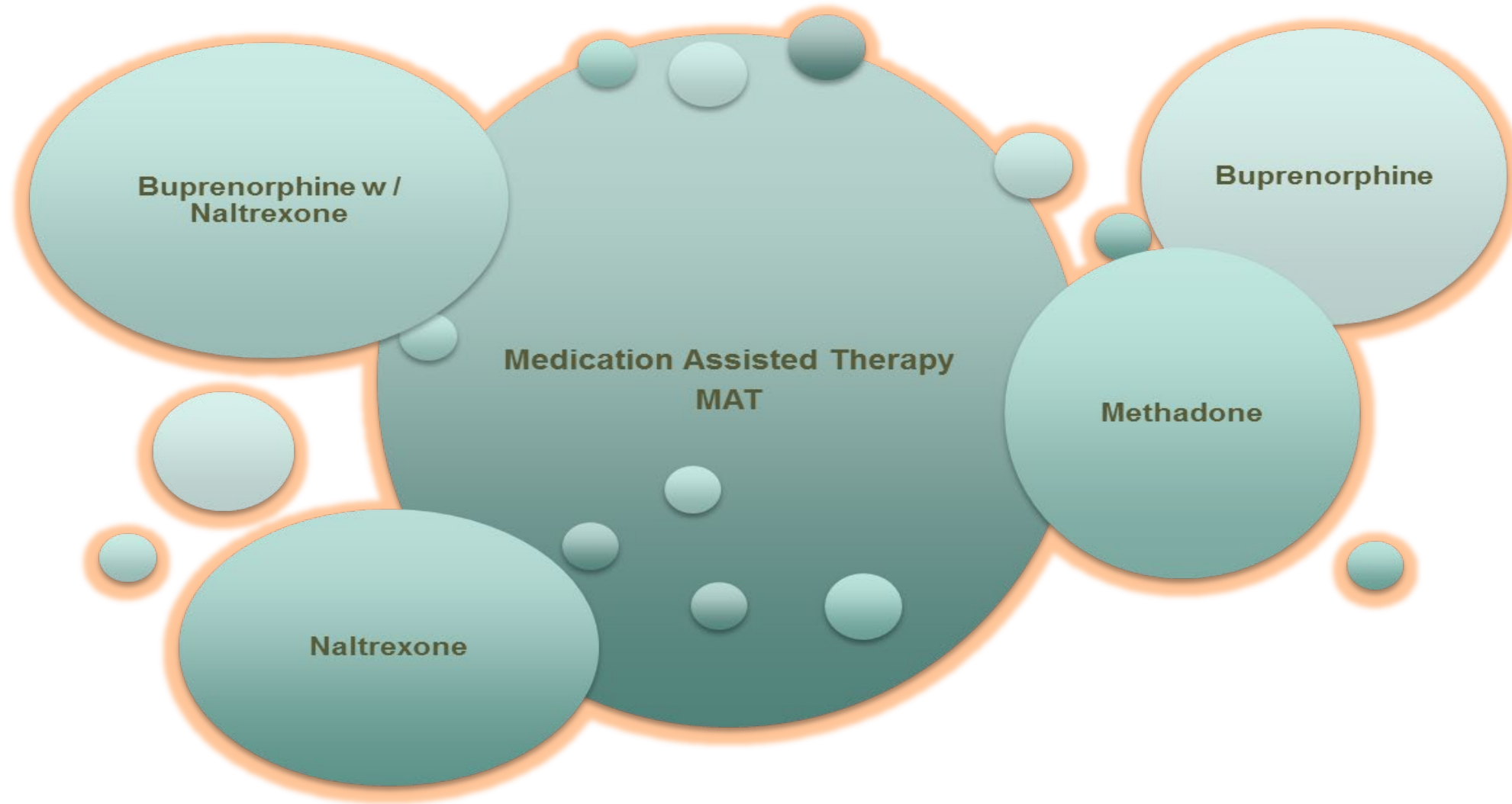
Social

Criminal Justice Kentucky Treatment Outcome Study 2017



Monetary

- 1 : 4.52
- 66.9% were employed
- 78.2% reported providing financial support to their children



Safety

- Less Incidents
- Less Contraband
- Less Violence
- 80.0% received services they needed to get better



Systems

- 56.0% had not been re-incarcerated.
- 82.3% were living in stable housing
- 79.4% considered the treatment program to be successful

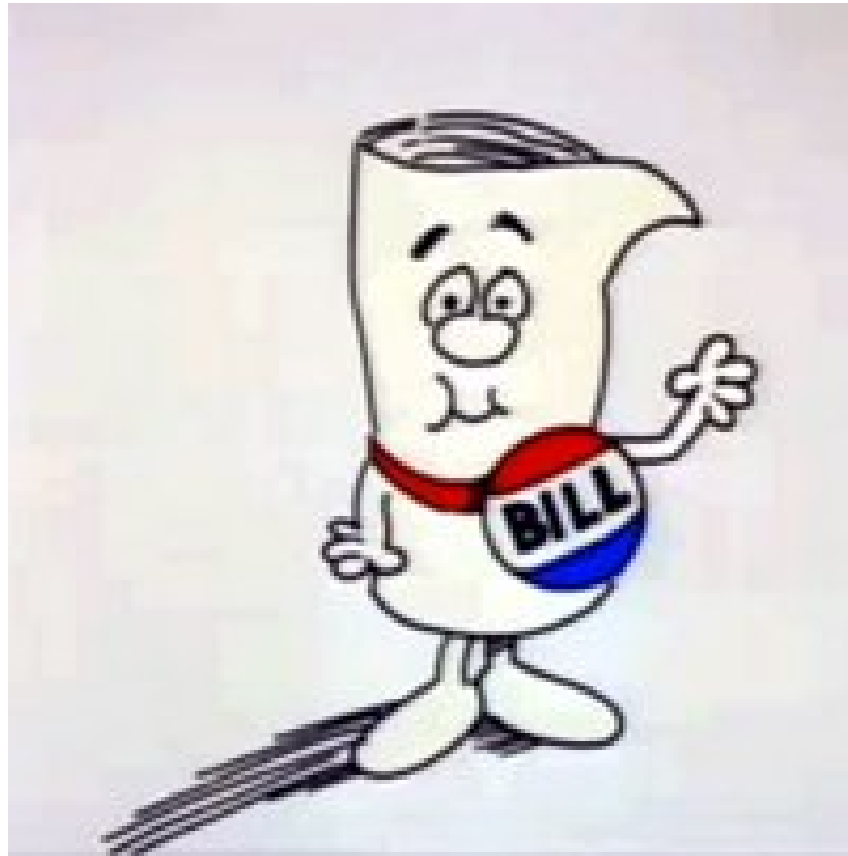

Legislative Changes



Expungement in Kentucky



List of Eligible Felonies for Expungement

Possession of controlled substance, 1st degree
Flagrant non support
Criminal possession of forged instrument, 2nd degree
Theft by unlawful taking
Criminal mischief, 1st degree
Receiving stolen property under \$10,000
Burglary, 3rd degree
Tampering with physical evidence
Forgery, 2nd degree
Theft by deception under \$10,000
Making a false statement regarding a prescription
Possess, manufacture, sell, dispense, etc. a counterfeit substance
Obtain a prescription without having formed a practitioner-patient relationship
Criminal possession of a forged prescription
Theft of motor vehicle plates/decal
Theft of mail matter
Cultivation of marijuana
Possession of controlled substance in 2nd degree *enhanced*
Theft of property lost, mislaid, or delivered by mistake
Possession of controlled substance in 3rd degree *enhanced*
Possession of a forgery device
Forgery of a prescription for a legend drug, 1st offense

Theft by extortion
Unauthorized use of automobile or other propelled vehicle
Unauthorized use/dissemination/receipt of DNA info
Theft, criminal possession, or trafficking of a prescription for legend drug
Trafficking in or transferring a dietary supplement
Promoting gambling
Unlawful sale/shipment of alcoholic beverages by out-of-state seller to a KY consumer
Counterfeiting intellectual property
Filing illegal lien Insurance Act
Engaging in real estate brokerage without license
Unlawful access to a computer in the second degree
Theft of labor
Obscuring identity of machine or other property
Operating a sham or front company
Sports bribery
Misuse of confidential information
Eavesdropping
Installing eavesdropping device
Conspiracy to promote gambling
Possession of gambling records in the first degree
